

## Fairs and Show Accepting YQCA

STATE	SHOW	DETAILS
Alaska	MatSu and Copper River District 4-H and FFA Junior Market Livestock Auction	Participants in the MatSu and Copper River District 4-H and FFA Junior Market Livestock Auction must have a current YQCA certificate.
Arizona	Arizona National Livestock Show	Beginning with the 2019 show, the Arizona National Livestock Show is requiring all junior livestock exhibitors to have completed a quality assurance training. We will accept YQCA or a state approved training (e.g. Texas validation).
Arizona	All county and state fair youth exhibitors	Will continue to accept Arizona Youth Livestock Quality Assurance certifications completed before January 1, 2018 until all currently valid certificates expire. Starting January 1, 2018, only YQCA certifications (online or instructor-led) will be offered.
California	Charles Craig Classic	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. In order to show at the 2019 Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course, and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.
California	San Diego County Fair	All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification in order to exhibit.
California	Ventura County Fair	All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification in order to exhibit.
California	24A-DAA, The Kings Fair	YQCA is required.
California	AgFest - San Joaquin	Requires all livestock exhibitors to be YQCA Certified for all animals except for Dogs and Cavies.

California	Alameda County Fair	Accepting YQCA beginning with 2018 show season.
California	Amador County Fair	Only YQCA certifications will be accepted and exhibitors must be able to provide proof of completion.
California	Antelope Valley Fair and Alfalfa Festival	YQCA is required, beginning with the 2019 show season.
California	California Mid State Fair	May 26, 2022. All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification in order to exhibit.
California	California State Fair	Will continue to accept valid California State Fair Quality Assurance and Ethics training certifications taken before December 31, 2016 for the 2017 and 2018 California State Fair. Starting in 2019, only YQCA certifications will be accepted.
California	Del Norte County Fair (Crescent City)	YQCA is required, beginning with the 2019 show season.
California	Desert Empire Fair	Requires YQCA beginning with the 2019 show season.
California	El Dorado County Fair	Starting in 2019, only YQCA certification will be accepted.
California	Humboldt County Fair	Requires YQCA at the beginning of the 2019 show season.
California	Kern County Fair	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. In order to show at the 2019 Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course, and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.

California	Mendocino County Fair and Apple Show	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. In order to show at the 2019 Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course, and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.
California	Napa Town and Country Fair	Requires YQCA at the beginning of the 2019 show season.
California	Nevada County Fair	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. To show at the Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.
California	OC Fair	As of January 1, 2019, YQCA certification (online or instructor-led) will be required for all beef cattle, market goats, market sheep, swine, turkeys, broilers, market rabbit exhibitors and all breeding animals shown by junior exhibitors.
California	Placer County Fair	May 10, 2022
California	Redwood Acres Fair	Requires YQCA at the beginning of the 2019 show season.

California	Redwood County Fair/12th DAA	<p>The California Department of Food &amp; Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. California	Southern California Fair	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. In order to show at the 2019 Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course, and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.
California	Yuba-Sutter Fair	The California Department of Food & Agriculture is requiring all youth livestock exhibitors showing at Fairs throughout California in 2019, to have completed the applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training. In order to show at the 2019 Fair, each livestock exhibitor is required to have completed an approved YQCA training course, and must be able to provide proof of completion upon request by any member of the Fair staff, or any representative from California Department of Food & Agriculture.
Colorado	National Western Stock Show	Starting with 2018 show.
Idaho	North Idaho State Fair Youth Stockshow and Sale	YQCA certification is required for youth 8 to 18 exhibiting at the Youth Stockshow and Sale.
Illinois	McLean, Livingston and Woodford Counties	McLean, Livingston and Woodford Counties will be requiring YQCA at their 4-H Show beginning of the 2020 show season.
Indiana	Indiana Fair exhibitors (4-H); all State Fair 4-H exhibitors	YQCA certification is required for all 4-H Members exhibiting beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, sheep, swine, poultry, and rabbits at county-level fairs and/or State Fair. Youth have the option to complete an in-person Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care course OR an online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) course.
Iowa	Dickinson County Fair; Spirit Lake, Iowa	All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification in order to exhibit.

Iowa	All county fair and State Fair Exhibitors	YQCA is required for all county fair exhibitors (both 4-H and FFA), as well as all State Fair FFA and 4-H exhibitors.
Iowa	National Pork Expo	Will continue to accept Youth PQA certifications until all currently valid certification expire. After that, only YQCA certifications will be accepted.
Iowa	All county fair exhibitors (both 4-H and FFA); all State Fair 4-H exhibitors	Will continue to accept FSQA test-out certifications until all currently valid certificates expire. After that, only YQCA certifications will be accepted.
Kansas	Shawnee County Fair	YQCA Training is still required for all Shawnee County Livestock Exhibitors 4-H Age 7-18(including Meat Rabbits & Broiler Meat Chickens for the Sale) and State Livestock Shows; Kansas State Fair & Kansas Junior Livestock Show(KJLS)
Louisiana	LSU AgCenter 4-H and FFA Spring Livestock Show	Beginning in the 2023 show, all exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification number to exhibit.
Michigan	Branch County Fair	All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification in order to exhibit.
Michigan	Missaukee Agricultural Youth Show	We will accept online or instructor led certification of current year to meet fair requirements.
Michigan	Upper Peninsula State Fair	A valid YQCA certification is required for all junior market livestock exhibitors (beef, swine, goats, lambs, poultry & eggs) beginning with the 2024 Fair.
Nebraska	All county and state fair exhibitors (4-H and FFA)	Will continue to accept Nebraska Livestock Quality Assurance certification until all currently valid certificates expire. After that, only YQCA certifications will be accepted.
New Mexico	New Mexico State Fair	April 21, 2022
North Dakota	North Dakota 4-H requires YQCA for state fair shows	Will continue to accept Nebraska Livestock Quality Assurance certification until all currently valid certificates expire. After that, only YQCA certifications will be accepted.

Oregon	American Dairy Goat Association National Show Youth Events	Fair Dates July 15-16, 2023. Beginning with the 2023 show, the American Dairy Goat Association National Show is requiring all youth events exhibitors to have completed a quality assurance training. We will accept YQCA or a state approved training.
Pennsylvania	BLUE VALLEY FARM SHOW INC	All county youth animal show exhibitors
South Dakota	All county and state fair 4-H and exhibitors	All exhibitors must have a valid YQCA certification or qualifying Youth Livestock Literacy Event in order to exhibit.
Tennessee	Henry County Fair Junior Livestock Show	YQCA is required.
Wisconsin	Wisconsin State Fair and Wisconsin County Fairs	The Wisconsin State Fair requires YQCA-approved training. Many county fairs in Wisconsin also require YQCA. Check with your county fair about YQCA requirements.
